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REGULATION

*of admission organization and performance
in the cycle of academic studies*

*in the University of Medicine and Pharmacy of Targu-Mures
for the 1st year, academic year 2010-2011*

According to the Education Law no.84/1995, republished with the subsequent changes and completion, to the Law 288/2004, regarding the organization of academic studies, with the subsequent changes and completion, to the Emergency Ordinance of the Government no.133/2000, regarding fee payable places of academic and post academic public education over the places financed by the state budget, approved with changes through Law no.441/2001 with subsequent changes,

on the basis of the Government Decision no. 1044/2002 related to the stimulation of pupils and students who received distinctions at international school Olympics organized by pre-university education, and of PhD students who obtained remarkable results in research activities, with subsequent changes and completion,

according to the Government Decision no. 749/06.07.2009 - for the approval of the domains classification, of the higher education structures and of the specializations/programs of academic studies accredited or authorized to function temporarily, of the Government Decision no.81/09 February 2010 – regarding the organization and functioning of The Ministry of Education, Research, Youth and Sports, of the University Senate Decision from 2010.02.17,

The University of Medicine and Pharmacy of Targu-Mures is organizing the admission exam in higher education for the cycle of academic studies on the basis of its own admission Methodology respecting the legislation in use.

The 1st chapter. Admission exam organization

Admission competition is organized in two sessions, July, respectively September, in case there are vacant places left.

For the organization and performance of the admission exam, a central Commission of admission is constituted, as well as specialty Commissions for the written exams and working Commissions.

The domains and specialties for which admission exams are organized are the ones stipulated by the Government Decision no.749/06.07.2009.

The University Senate proposes schooling figures for the studies financed by the state budget as well as for the fee payable places; after their approval by The Ministry of Education, Research, Youth and Sports, they are allocated to faculties and specialties.

Submission period, date and assessment of contest, established by the University Senate are:

- **Submission period: 2010.07.12 – 2010.07.17**
- **Date of contest: 2010.07.21, admission fee 200 RON**

- **Contest assessments, as following:**

A. For the specializations sectorially regulated in the European Union: Medicine, Dental Medicine and Pharmacy – admission with a 3 hours multiple choice written paper is required. For the specialization Physical Education and Sport, admission is organized in the form of practical examination.

(*) Content units at Physics are:

The 9th grade (according to the analytical program no.3458/09.03.2004):

1. Geometrical optics

The 10th grade (according to the analytical program no.4598/31.08.2004):

1. Elements of thermodynamics
2. Production and use of distributive current
3. Production and use of alternative current

The 11th grade (according to the analytical program no. 3252/13.02.2006):

1. Oscillations and electromagnetic waves
2. Wave optics

The school textbooks used to establish the admission themes are alternative textbooks, valid for the subjects and high school grades approved by the Ministry of Education, Research, Youth and Sports.

(**) The specific methodology for examination at the specialization Physical Education and Sport can be found in the **Candidate Guide – Admission 2010**, published on the **website of the University**.

Admission at university studies can be attended in Romanian or in the language of national minorities, if examination topics were studied in the same language during high school.

B. For the specializations sectorially regulated in the European Union: **General Medical Assistance and Midwifery** and the generally regulated specializations: **Dental Technics, Pharmacy Assistance, Balneo - Physiokinetotherapy and recovery, Nutrition and Dietetics** a **file contest** will be organized; the admission grade is calculated as arithmetic average of high school finals and the average of the baccalaureate examination finals.

C. For the specialization **Medicine in English** admission consists in an English competence test (for candidates who don't possess a linguistic competence certificate) and an interview, on the basis of the submitted file.

The 2nd chapter II. Admission conditions

The admission contest can be attended by high school graduates with baccalaureate diploma (or it's equivalent) and/or by students, who wish to attend a second specialization, respecting the conditions mentioned below.

The Citizens of the European Union countries, of the countries members of the European Economic Space and of the Swiss Confederation can participate, under the same legal circumstances as the Romanian citizens, including tuition fee terms and conditions; these candidates need to acquire in advance the recognition of the studies

followed in their native countries by the Specialty Direction inside the Ministry of Education, Research, Youth and Sports. At submission they will submit a linguistic competence certificate for Romanian language issued by the empowered institutions.

The candidate can enroll at two specializations, paying only one enrolment fee; the candidates' classification will be done on the basis of the first option.

In case a candidate is admitted to two specializations at places subsidized by the State, the candidate has to opt for one of them, by presenting the file with the required original documents before the deadline set by the University.

High school graduates with a baccalaureate diploma who have received during high school years 1st, 2nd, 3rd, honorable and special prizes at International Subject-based Contests as well as candidates with 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes at National Subject-based Contests or in groups of countries at one of the entry examination subjects and which can be found on the contestant lists issued by the Ministry of Education, Research, Youth and Sports can enroll without sitting the entrance examinations, on subsidized positions. The students who have won distinctions during high school at International Subject-based Contests can be admitted to two specializations places financed by the state.

Graduates with an academic degree of state universities can follow a secondary specialization on fee payable place, under the conditions issued by the Senate of the University.

The number of available places for this category will be set by the Senate of the University and will be made public.

In the national system of university education, during one cycle of studies, a candidate who has been admitted can benefit by state financing for a single field and a single university.

The 3rd chapter. Candidates' enrolment

Conditions and documents required for enrolment are posted at headquarter of the university and on its website.

Required documents for enrolment:

- **standardized application form**
- **baccalaureate certificate or a certificate equivalent to it, original or authenticated copy.** 2010 graduates can attach a proof of high school graduation and of the fact that they have passed the baccalaureate examination, mentioning the average of the baccalaureate examination and the finals of the high school studies. Candidates from the above mentioned category, declared admitted after contest, have to submit at the faculty the baccalaureate certificate in original, until

the date established by the leading board of the University

- **register extract, original or equivalent (with the school finals) or authenticated copy**
- **certificate of birth, authenticated copy**
- **copy of the identification card**
- **medical certificate** issued by the general practitioner from the residence town and **a psychiatric examination from the specialist**, saying they are capable for the specialization they enroll for.

Candidates suffering from chronic conditions will present medical certificates approved by the county medical commissions of learning and professional orientation from Targu-Mures (not from the residence county). The certificates will mention the deficiency degree, according to its localization, in conformity with the medical criteria of learning and professional orientation in use. **Not declaring these conditions will draw the institutional consequences in use. A specialty commission named by the Leading Board of the University will analyze these documents.**

- **4 identity card type photographs**
- **proof of paying the examination fee.** Examination fee is 200 lei and it has to be paid at the cashier of the university. The bill is added to the enrolment folder.
- **documents proving the justification of request of sparing of payment of examination fees** (authenticated copies of the parents death certificates, certificates from the orphanage, authenticated copy of the death certificate of the hero-martyr parent who passed away during Revolution or, of the medical certificate or any other proof in case the candidate himself was wounded during the Revolution in December 1989). Orphans of both parents, those coming from orphanages or foster care, the children of heroes-martyrs deceased during Revolution as well as the candidates wounded during the Revolution in December 1989 are spared of payment of examination fees. Children of the teaching staff (in activity, pensioner or deceased) are spared of payment of examination fees according to the Law no.128/1997, art. 108, paragraph (2) as well as the children of administrative staff of the respective university.

The candidates benefiting from the Law no. 128/1997, art.108, paragraph (2) regarding the Status of the teaching personnel can use this privilege once in the higher education institution (baccalaureate certificate in original is attached to the payment sparing request)

- **two envelope-like folders**

The candidates have to enroll at the secretarial office of the faculties, during the working

schedule, posted on the admission panel.

The 4th chapter. The admission ongoing

After enrolments are over and candidates' folders are checked, lists with the candidates' names will be posted in alphabetical order in a visible place, with at least 24 hours before the beginning of the entrance examination, on standard tables which contain faculty, specialization, language of examination and repartition on contest rooms. Any intimation regarding mistakes made among the data mentioned on the tables is checked immediately, the corrections being made directly on the posted lists with the Rector's approval, with 3 hours the latest before the examination.

The contest rooms will be previously adapted to the conditions necessary to ensure security during written examination. In each room an examination commission will be named, consisting of a room responsible, paper responsible and supervisor to ensure the ongoing of the written examination in good conditions, according to the contest methodology.

The test questions generated by the computer will be put together in a questionnaire, edited in two languages, Romanian and Hungarian, in four variants. The questions are answered in a multiple-choice test.

At the end of the examination time (3 hours), the multiple choice tests are handed in under signature to the room responsible, who hands them in to the Central Commission of Admission.

The 5th chapter. The admission results

Paper tests are corrected through computerized reading; the results are registered in mark registers signed by the faculty dean and countersigned by the rector of the University.

Exam papers are marked by a group of three persons.

The candidates' admission for the free tuition fee places is strictly established in the descending order of their averages and within the number of places approved for each specialization.

On request, the candidates below the "line of admission" can benefit from the places with tuition fee, within the limits of the approved places, in a descending order of the results.

The minimum admission average score cannot be lower than 5 (five).

The results of the admission contest are posted in a visible place.

In case of equal average scores, partition is done by approved partition criteria.

Appeals can be handed in maximum 48 hours from the date and hour of posting the

admission results. The solving and answering time is the most 3 days from the deadline of their registration; the appeal commission decision is final.

The vacant places left after admission are distributed at University level, according to the provisions in use.
